The conference moves across the country, being held in a different location every year. Selkirk College is proud to partner with CRRF to host the 2017 conference to be held in Nelson from September 20-23, 2017.



The theme of this year's conference is [Different by Design](#) – exploring innovation in rural places and sharing stories of opportunities and possibilities from across the country. This includes conversations on:

- **Workforces of tomorrow.** Looking to the jobs that will exist in the future, how we prepare for those jobs while dealing with the challenges we have today?
- **Our changing environment.** How are we addressing and adapting to the changes in our surrounding environment?
- **Creating connections.** How are we building relationships, partnerships, and collaborations in order to address complicated problems with limited resources?
- **Communities of opportunity.** What innovative and unique development opportunities exist for rural places?
